
References generally have four elements, each of which has a corresponding question for you to answer:

Author: Who is responsible for this work?Date: When was this work published?

Title: What is this work called?

Source: Where can I retrieve this work?

By using these four elements and answering these four questions, you should be able to create a citation for any type of source.

To create your references, you'll simply look for these elements in your source and put them together in your reference list entry.
